2. Financial report	James reported that the YSAC balance on the books at the Council on Alcoholism & Addictions of the Finger Lakes is presently \$10,260 .		
3. Update on the progress of the Youth Survey	George reported he has had contact with the manager of Evalumetrics with the intention of doing the survey for the 2 school districts this year. The cost for the survey and results is \$2000. At this point in time, George has not approached the Marcus Whitman District about doing the survey in their grades. The Penn Yan Central School District is prepared to do the survey this year, but as of yet, no date has been identified.		



George reports we do have the organization to supply the survey, but there is nothing in the budget to pay for this. There has been 2-3 years between the cycles of offering the survey. And, there may have been data from 3 different cycles before this one.

Deb shared that Schuyler County does a survey every year, but uses a different company. That survey has an automatic consent, so parents would have to "opt out" if they do not want their students to take the survey.

George reported that the Evalumetrics youth survey includes strengths/weaknesses and risks. The grade range for this survey is from Middle School through High School students and is done on-line. The survey asks questions about the students' lives, but is anonymous. The results are focused on measuring the ability of the child's resilience. If YSAC chooses, mental health issues can be added.

Data from the survey measures experience with drugs, alcohol, tobacco, risk-taking behaviors, and activities within the community.

Idelle made a motion for YSAC to pay the \$2000 charge for the survey from Evalumetrics. Lauren and Patti both seconded the

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Discussion followed on who will go out to	
providers to train on how to prescribe	
Suboxone (Buprenorhine).	
-Drug Court may not accept individuals	
who access Buprenorphine.	
-Suboxone is very addictive and hard to	
get off.	
-Have to use Suboxone wisely to save	
lives. It may not have an exit plan under	
short term program.	
-It is considered a "Harm Reduction"	
model, but comes with	
cognitive/emotional challenges.	
-Deb stated she will not ask YCPH staff to	
go out and educate providers on	
prescribing Buprenorphine.	
-George reported that Finger Lakes	
Health is using MAT (Medication Assisted	
Treatment) in the Emergency Dept. , with	
a provider doing the follow-up. The focus	
is on getting patient off original drug. The	
Provider needs to be part of the process.	
-Treatment in Syracuse is to get outreach	
going to help with treatment	
intervention.	
-A sustained/intact community	
treatment center is needed with good	



communication in order to treat patients with compassion and confidentiality. -Vivitrol is being offered to inmates in YC Jail when they leave. Jail Doctor has received more training on use of this drug. Although, there are life risks with this drug if used without any follow-up. Lauren asked if YSAC could get an update from FLACRA on treatment programs in progress and what kind of community support is there. *George reported finishing input on the national grant through the Federal "Systems of Care" program for adults and children. -25-39 agencies have signed on to integrate adults and children's care quality of life issues. A single point of entry is the goal. This plans to better involve the community, families, and children in the process. -HRSA grant - is a 4 year grant. Essex and Yates Counties have been chosen to participate. One full time person will help Grant needs to be submitted by February 2nd, 2020. If given to families.
